**AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Freeport.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. & S. L., 1951, c. 207, § 1, amended.** The 3rd sentence of section 1 of chapter 207 of the private and special laws of 1951 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Nothing herein shall prohibit any inhabitant, ~~or temporary resident~~ or any riparian owner of shores or flats within said town, from digging or taking clams for food for himself and family without license; provided the amount so taken shall not be in excess of  $\frac{1}{2}$  bushel per tide per preson.'
