STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Loss of Hunting and Fishing Licenses on Conviction for Night Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 37, § 74, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 74 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The Commissioner may revoke the license, for I year from the date of conviction, issued to a person to carry on the particular activity in which he was engaged at the time of the violation of sections 71, 72, 75, 76, 77, 81, 90, 91, 92, 97 and 101.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 37, § 77, amended. Section 77 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Any person convicted of a violation under the provisions of this section shall have his license to hunt and fish revoked by the court for not less than 2 years nor more than 5 years. If at the time of committing a violation of any provision of this section, the offender shall not be the holder of a hunting or fishing license, a license to hunt or fish shall not be granted to said person until at least 2 years and not more than 5 years have elapsed from the date of final determination of any complaint or legal proceedings instituted as a result of the violation.'
