IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to the Use of Lights for Lighting Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 97-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 97-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 97-A. Lights from or attached to motor vehicles. It shall be unlawful to use any artificial light from or attached to any motor vehicle to hunt deer from September 1st to December 31st, both days inclusive. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any rule and regulation promulgated by the Chief of the State Police.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$50.'
