STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Amending the Maine Employment Security Law as to Definition of Unemployment, Total and Partial.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 29, § 3, sub-§ XVII, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection XVII of section 3 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'A. An individual shall be deemed "totally unemployed" in any week with respect to which no wages are payable to him and during which he performs no services; except that remuneration payable or received as holiday pay shall not be deemed wages for the purpose of this subsection.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 29, § 3, sub-§ XVII, \P B, amended. Paragraph B of subsection XVII of section 3 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'B. An individual shall be deemed "partially unemployed" in any week of less than full-time work if his wages payable from any source for such week are less than the weekly benefit amount he would be entitled to receive if totally unemployed and eligible; except that remuneration payable or reecived as holiday pay shall not be demed wages for the purpose of this subsection.'
