IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

**AN ACT Relating to Tables, Booths, etc. on Certain Premises Licensed to Sell
Liquor.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 61, § 33, amended. The third sentence of section 33 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No licensee under the provisions of this section, except taverns, shall maintain a bar where malt liquor is consumed, **or shall sell, serve or deliver malt liquor, to other than bona fide hotel guests in their rooms as registered, except to persons seated at tables, counters or booths in plain view of other patrons.**'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 61, § 42, amended. The last sentence of section 42 of chapter 61 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No licensee for the sale of liquor to be consumed on the premises where sold shall be himself, clerk, servant or agent, sell, give, furnish or deliver any liquor to be consumed elsewhere than upon the licensed premises, **nor to any persons not seated at tables, counters or booths in plain view of other patrons,** except, subject to the provisions of law and the rules and regulations of the Commission, hotel licensees may sell liquor in the original packages to bona fide registered room guests.'
