STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Weight Tolerances for Motor Vehicles Carrying Firewood,
Pulpwood, Logs or Bolts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 167, additional. Chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 167, to read as follows:

'Sec. 167. Weight tolerance for firewood, pulpwood, logs and bolts. The operation on the highways of any vehicle loaded entirely with firewood, pulpwood, logs or bolts shall not be deemed tobe in violation of any of the provisions of sections 19, 36, 109, 110 and 111 relating to weights of vehicles, weights of loads, tonnages or overloads if the gross weight of such vehicle and its load does not exceed 110% of the maximum gross weight for which such vehicle is then registered.'
