IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Licenses to Teach in Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 41, § 186-A, additional. Chapter 41 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 186-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 186-A. Certificate of qualification to continue without further training. Any graduate of an approved teachers college, who has attained a degree in the field of education, shall be granted a certificate of qualification to teach in the public schools for which his training so qualifies him. Such certificate shall continue during good behaviour and no additional or further training or academic qualification shall be required for the continuance of the certificate to teach in the said respective schools. Any further training or academic qualifications shall be required only for purposes of schedules of salary or advancement but not for continued teaching.'
