STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Providing Free Hunting, Trapping and Fishing Licenses to Indians on Census List.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 39, sub-§ X. The first and second sentences of subsection X of section 39 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

The Commissioner shall issue a hunting, trapping and fishing license to any Indian over the age of 16 years of the Passamaquoddy and Penobscot tribes without any charge or fee, providing the Indian presents a certificate from the Commissioner of Health and Welfare stating that the person described is an Indian and a member of that tribe on the census list. For the purpose of this section, an Indian shall be a person whose mother and father were Indians.'
