STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating of Traffic Officers at Drive-in Theaters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 100, § 79-A, additional. Chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 79-A to read as follows:

'Drive-in Theaters.

Sec. 79-A. Traffic officer at drive-in theaters. Whoever, being an owner, lessee or tenant of a drive-in theater, shall employ a uniformed police officer to direct traffic from any main highway to and from the theater. Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
