STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Leather Poisoning as an Occupational Disease.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 31, § 69, amended. Paragraph numbered "13." of section 69 of chapter 31 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

- '13. Dermatitis (venenata).
- 13. Any process involving the use of or direct contact with acids, alkalies, acids or oil, or with brick, cement, lime, concrete or mortar, or leather in the process of manufacturing capable of causing dermatitis (venenata), but exclusive of soaps and cleaning materials.'
