IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Criminal Appeal Cases in Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 106, § 11, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 11 of chapter 106 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'III. Cumberland: At Portland on the 1st Tuesday of every month except July and August; but the criminal business of said county shall be transacted at the terms held on the 1st Tuesdays of January, May and September, together with civil business. The January, May and September terms of said court may be kept open for criminal business after their final adjournment for civil business for such time as the presiding justice may deem expedient, provided that they shall be finally adjourned at least 7 days before the convening of the next succeeding term in which criminal business may be done and all business having to do with criminal appeal cases and pending indictments may be transacted at Portland on the 1st Tuesday of every month except July and August; and criminal appeal cases from municipal courts and trial justice courts in Cumberland County may be appealed or bailed to the next term of Cumberland County Superior Court at Portland.'
