STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Eugene F. Young of South Portland.

Eugene F. Young; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the State the sum of \$25 to be paid to Eugene F. Young, of South Portland, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State, for damage done and goods taken by a boy from the State School for Boys.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On July 1, 1954 Mr. Young's store was broken into by one of the boys from the State School for Boys. Cigarettes, candy, tobacco, cigarette lighters, fluid, flints, etc. were taken; also \$26 in cash which was found on the boy and returned to Mr. Young by South Portland Police. Mr. Young would like the \$25 reimbursement to cover his loss.
