# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to Trespass on Land of Another.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 131, § 41, amended. Section 41 of chapter 131 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 41. Trespass on timber or wood standing, etc. Whoever, except a road commissioner acting within the scope of his lawful authority, willfully commits any trespass by cutting, destroying or carrying away timber or wood on the land of another; by digging up, taking and carrying away therefrom earth, stone, grass, corn, grain, fruit, hay or other vegetables, or by carrying away from any wharf or Inding place goods in which he has no interest, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50 \$100 and by imprisonment for not more than 2 months.'
