RESOLVE, in Favor of Harold B. Gross, of Waldoboro.

Harold B. Gross; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$213.76 to be paid to Harold B. Gross, of Waldoboro, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the State, for the cost of replacement of sewer damaged in March 1951, by construction of highway on Route 220, said sewer leading from the former hotel property of James Duanne to the Maine Water Company sewer.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On March 25, 1951, the A. P. Wyman, Inc. of Waterville, Maine, reconstructed the highway known as Route 220 leading from Waldoboro to Friendship. During said construction the A. P. Wyman, Inc. being employed by the State of Maine and under the State Highway Commission to reconstruct said highway, and while the highway was being constructed the blasting ruined the sewer leading from the Harold B. Gross property, so that Mr. Gross in reconstructing said sewer in 1954, was obliged to spend \$213.76. (The State of Maine states that it cost them \$75 for putting a new pavement over where he constructed the same.)
