STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Registration for Barbers and Apprentice Barbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 219, sub-§ I, amended. Subsection I of section 219 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 'I. Who is at least 18 17 years of age;'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 25, § 219, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 219 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 'III. Who has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction, of 1,000 hours in not less than 6 months, in a school of barbering approved by said Board and a total experience as an apprentice of a period of at least 6 months under a licensed barber; or in lieu thereof has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction of 1,500 hours in not less than 9 months in a school of barbering approved by said Board; or in lieu thereof has had a total experience in the practice of barbering or as an apprentice of 2,500 hours distributed over a period of at least 18 months.'
