IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Forest Fire Control for Certain Territory Under Maine Forestry District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36, § 95, amended. Section 95 of chapter 36 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following paragraph:

‘Whenever, upon application by the residents of any plantation, township or part of the unorganized territory of the State within the Maine Forestry District, it shall appear to the Commissioner that such plantation, township or part of the unorganized territory by its location in the State is so situated that it cannot receive adequate or desirable forest fire control and protection under the Maine Forestry District, such plantation, township or part of the unorganized territory, with the approval of the Commissioner and the Attorney General, may withdraw from the Maine Forestry District upon complying with the requirements for forest fire protection and control as shall be determined from time to time by the Commissioner. Upon withdrawal from the Maine Forestry District, such plantation, township or part of the unorganized territory shall be subject to the provisions of the laws which govern organized towns, cities and plantations in the forest fire control under the Forestry Department.’
