MEMORIAL

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of
America in Congress Assembled

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO PASS JOINT
RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE FOURTH SATURDAY IN
AUGUST OF EACH YEAR AS

“CHILDREN’S DAY IN SPORTS”

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in the Ninety-Seventh Legislative Session assembled, most respectfully present and petition your Honorable Body as follows:

WHEREAS, the future of America depends upon our youth, whose basic training should include the requisites of good sportsmanship; and

WHEREAS, recreation is one of the necessary parts of any program affecting our children; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That we, your Memorialists, recommend to the Congress of the United States enactment of a Joint Resolution Designating the Fourth Saturday in August of Each Year as “Children’s Day in Sports”; and be it further

Resolved: That a copy of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be immediately transmitted by the Secretary of State to the Senate and House of Representatives in Congress and to the members of the said Senate and House of Representatives from this State.
