AN ACT Relating to the Use of Artificial Lights for Lighting Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 37, § 97-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 97-A, to read as follows :

'Sec. 97-A. Use of artificial lights for lighting game. The deliberate use of an artificial light between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise to illuminate, jack or show up wild birds or animals shall be unlawful between October 1st and December 31st of each calendar year, except as provided in subsection IV of section 113.'
