**RESOLVE, Authorizing the Setting Out of Buoys in Sebago Lake.**

---

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the waters of Sebago Lake are used my many boats of all sizes; and

Whereas, only a portion of the dangerous areas of the lake are now marked; and

Whereas, another year's delay in completing the project of designating the dangerous areas will constitute a hazard to life and limb; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**Buoying of Sebago Lake Authorized. Resolved:** That the Public Utilities Commission be, and hereby is, authorized to permit any interested person or persons to set out in Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, properly marked buoys in such places where in the opinion of the Public Utilities Commission a hazard to boating exists; such setting out to be under the supervision and direction of the Public Utilities Commission.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Resolve shall take effect when approved.
