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**RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Freeport for Aid Extended to Family  
of Earl S. Williams.**

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**Town of Freeport; reimbursed. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the State the sum of \$4,827.89 to be paid to the town of Freeport to reimburse the town for aid given to Earl Stanley Williams and family, state paupers.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

From 1949 to 1955 Earl S. Williams and family received general relief from the town of Freeport in the amount of \$3,439.13 and aid to dependent children from April 1948 to March 1953, the town's share of which was \$1,388.76, making a total of \$4,827.89. In January, 1956 the State Department of Health and Welfare, after investigation, accepted the case as having no settlement in the State and therefore a case for which the State is liable. The purpose of this resolve is to reimburse the town of Freeport for funds expended on this so-called non-settled case.
