STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Instruction Permits to Drive Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th sentences of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 181 of the public laws of 1955, are hereby amended to read as follows:

The Secretary of State may, in his discretion, after applicant has successfully passed all parts of an examination other than the driving test, issue to the applicant an instruction permit which shall entitle the applicant, while having such permit in his immediate possession, to drive a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of 60 120 days when accompanied by a licensed operator who has at least one year of driving experience and is at least 18 years of age and who is occupying a seat beside the driver, except in the event the permittee is operating a motorcycle, motor scooter or motor bike. The fee for all permits shall be \$\frac{\psi}{2}\$, which shall include cost of first examination. Such examination shall include law, eye and blood tests. The fee for all subsequent examinations shall be \$1. A renewal permit may be issued for an additional 60 120 days for a fee of \$1; provided, however, that the Secretary of State may, in his discretion, issue a restricted instruction permit effective for a school year or for a restricted period to an applicant who is enrolled in a driver education program which includes practice driving.'
