HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 157, L. D. 204, Resolve, Proposing an  
Amendment to the Constitution Changing the Tenure of  
Office of the Governor to Four-Year Terms.

Amend said Resolve by striking out in the 3rd and 4th lines of  
that part designated "Section 2" the underlined words "and shall  
not be eligible to succeed himself" and inserting in place thereof  
the following underlined sentence:

'The person who has served an elective term of office as Governor  
shall be ineligible to succeed himself.'

Further amend said Resolve by striking out the second paragraph  
of that part which relates to form of question and date when amend-  
ment shall be voted upon and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
ing:

'"Shall the Constitution, which now provides for a two-year  
term for Governor, be amended as proposed by a resolution of the  
Legislature, to a four-year term with a further limitation that he  
shall not succeed himself after serving one elective term."'
