STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Lobster Meat.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 116, amended. The fifth paragraph of section 116 of chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed, as follows:

'It shall be lawful for holders of a wholesale sea food dealer's and processor's license to receive meat from other states and countries providing such meat is immediately processed and hermetically scaled in all metal or metal and glass containers for resale as processed stews, newburgs or chowders, in the retail trade. Such meat shall not be resold unless processed as above and it must conform to legal standards of the states or countries from which it originates. The purchaser of such meat is required to file a monthly statement of such shipments received with the Commissioner on forms furnished by the Commissioner and the shipping containers cannot be opened until immediately prior to processing of the meat.'
