#### RESOLVE, Providing for a Traveling Clinic for Education of Mentally Retarded Children.

A traveling clinic; education for mentally retarded children. Resolved: That there is hereby appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$45,018 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 and \$45,018 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1959 to provide for one full-time traveling clinic for the education of mentally retarded children.

*Purchase of an 8 seat station wagon (1st year)	
Maintenance, gasoline and oil for 30,000 miles	
Pediatricians' fees-paid as required	
Total Plus travel allowances for board and lodging	\$37,718 \$7,300
Total	\$45,018

\*Note: It is estimated that mileage for personnel to conduct necessary travel at 7c per mile would be much more expensive than cost of the station wagon.
