STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Authorizing State of Maine to Convey Certain Land in Fort Kent.

State of Maine to convey land; authorizing. Resolved: That the Governor, in the name of the State of Maine, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute and convey by quitclaim deed to the town of Fort Kent, the interest of the State in a certain piece or parcel of land situated in township eighteen (18), range seven (7), now a part of the town of Fort Kent, in the county of Aroostook and State of Maine, a strip or parcel of land out of original lot no. thirty (30), which is bounded as follows, to wit: On the westerly side of main highway, known as Pleasant street; on the northerly side by land of Mattie Pinette; on the easterly side by the Fish river, and on the southerly side by land of G. H. Page on which is situated his potato starch factory.

Being the same premises conveyed to State Military Defense Commission by inhabitants of Fort Kent by deed dated June 29, 1954 and recorded in Northern District, Aroostook county, book 256, page 24.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Baker lot, so called, in Fort Kent was deeded to the State Military Defense Commission which now have no use for the land. At a meeting, the Defense Commission, following an explanation of the circumstances whereby two lots for armory purposes had been deeded by the town of Fort Kent to the State, immediately passed a vote to recommend passage of a resolve, transferring the Baker lot back to Fort Kent, early in the next session of the Maine Legislature.
