STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Methods of Taking Clams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 49-A, additional. Chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 49-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 49-A. Methods of taking clams. Clams shall not be taken except by devises or instruments operated solely by hand power. In the taking or for the purpose of taking such clams, the flats shall not be dug, raked, loosened or disturbed by the propeller or other part of any boat or hydraulic dredge.'
