STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Right to Vote of Civilian Employees Resident at Togus.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 3, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, as follows:

'Every citizen, who meets the requirements of this section and who is a civilian residing on the Veterans Administration Center at Togus, shall have the right to vote in all state, county and national elections, including primary elections, in either Chelsea or Augusta, Kennebec county, upon application to the municipal officers of Chelsea or the board of registration of Augusta. The municipal officers of Chelsea and the board of registration in Augusta are authorized to place the names of such citizens on the voting lists.'
