STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Assessing a Poll Tax on Females.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91-A, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 91-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section one of chapter 399 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Poll tax. A poll tax of \$3 shall be assessed upon every male and female resident of the State above the age of 21 years whether a citizen of the United States or an alien, in the place where he or she resides on the first day of each April, unless he or she is exempted therefrom by the provisions of this chapter. No person shall be considered a resident of a place merely on account of being present there as a student in an educational institution.'
