COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 127, L. D. 340, Bill, "An Act

Creating an Interstate Compact on Mental Health."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 2. R. S., c. 27, §116, amended. Section 116 of chapter 27 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 116. Transfer of insane persons from out of the state institutions. The Commissioner may, upon the request of a competent authority of a state ether-than-Maine, or of the District of Columbia, which is not a member of the Interstate Compact on Mental Health, grant authorization for the transfer of an insane patient directly to a Maine State Hospital;, provided that said patient has a-settlement-in-a-Maine-municipality-acknowledged-by-the-municipal-officers thereof resided in the State of Maine for a period of one year; that said patient is currently confined in a recognized state institution for the care of the insane as the result of proceedings considered legal by that state; that a duly certified copy of the original commitment proceedings and a copy of the patient's case history is supplied; that if, after investigation, the Commissioner shall deem such a transfer justifiable; and that all expenses incident to such a transfer be borne by the agency requesting same. When the Commissioner has authorized such a transfer, the Superintendent of the State Hospital designated by him shall receive the patient as having been regularly committed to said Hospital under the laws of this State.'"
