AN ACT Repealing the Assessment of Towns for Aid to Dependent Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 243, repealed. Section 243 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby repealed, as follows:

'Sec. 243. Towns to be assessed. The state shall recover from the city, town or plantation in which the child so aided has legal settlement, 18% of the amount expended for aid to each dependent child, which shall be credited to the regular legislative appropriation for aid to dependent children. Whenever it appears that a city, town or plantation is delinquent in making reimbursements to the state, the amounts shall be collected by the state in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as state taxes. Any balance due shall be assessed in the succeeding year in the same manner as other state taxes.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall become effective on October 1, 1957.
