### AN ACT Relating to Closed Time on Deer in Oxford County.

---

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 37, § 91, amended.** The first paragraph of section 91 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'There shall be an annual open season on deer during the month of November in each calendar year in the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, Hancock, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, ~~Oxford~~ Sagadahoc, Waldo, Washington and York. All the rest of the calendar year before and after the open season shall be a closed season on deer.'

**Sec. 2. R. S., c. 37, § 91, amended.** Section 91 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto 2 new paragraphs to follow the first paragraph, to read as follows:

'There shall be an annual open season on deer in each calendar year from the 15th day of October to the 30th day of November, both dates inclusive, in the county of Oxford north of the Appalachian Trail. All the rest of the calendar year before and after the open season shall be a closed season on deer.'

There shall be an annual open season on deer in each calendar year from the 5th day of November to the 5th day of December, both dates inclusive, in the county of Oxford south of the Appalachian Trail. All the rest of the calendar year before and after the open season shall be a closed season on deer.'
