RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Hubert E. Redding, South Berwick.

Teacher's pension granted to Hubert E. Redding. Resolved: That Hubert E. Redding, of South Berwick, be given credit for an additional 3 years of teaching service in a private school so that he may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 63-A; provided that the said Hubert E. Redding shall contribute to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$225.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Redding taught 3 years in Pine Tree Academy, Auburn, in a private school which operated from about 1921 to 1933, and closed because of financial difficulties during the depression years. He taught about 1922-25. This school was duly certified by the State Department of Education and served the youth of this State during that period of time. The graduates have gone out into the State in lines of public work, including teaching. Mr. Redding has 22 years of public school work in Maine.
