STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications for Disability Pensions for Members of the Lewiston Police Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 22, amended. Section 22 of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as repealed and replaced by section 9 of chapter 86 of the private and special laws of 1943, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 22. Pensions, application for. When application is made for pension because of permanent disability while in active service, the applicant shall satisfy the commission that he is permanently disabled and that his disability was incurred in the discharge of his duties as a member of the department or while on authorized leave.'
