STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, In Favor of Town of Milo for Aid to Emile Thibodeau.

Town of Milo; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the State the sum of \$152.37 to be paid to the town of Milo to reimburse it for aid given to Emile Thibodeau.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On May 25, 1955, John Buttery, a Police officer for the town of Milo, found Emile Thibodeau in a very bad physical condition and lying on the bank of Sebec stream in Milo. Mr. Thibodeau was taken to the Gallant Hospital.

Mr. Thibodeau agreed to pay the hospital in full as soon as he could get back to work and as a consequence there was no affidavit taken and the town of Milo did not pay the hospital and doctor bills that were obligated.

On January 11, 1956, Mr. Harold Gates, an official of the town of Millinocket called and said that Mr. Thibodeau had died on December 4, 1955.
