STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Claims for Compensation for Hernia.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 31, § 8-A, additional. Chapter 31 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 8-A, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 8-A. Claims for compensation for hernia. In all cases of hernia claims it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the Commission:
 - I. That the descent of the hernia immediately followed as the result of sudden effort, severe strain or the application of force directly to the abdominal wall;
 - II. That there was severe pain in the hernial region;
 - III. That such prostration resulted so that the employee was compelled to cease work immediately;
 - IV. That the occurrence of the hernia was noticed by the claimant and communicated to the employer within 72 hours;
 - V. That the physical distress following the occurrence of the hernia was such so as to require the attendance of a licensed physician or surgeon within 72 hours of such occurrence.'
