STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Persons to Whom Liquor Licenses May Not Be Issued.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 29, amended. Section 29 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 71 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by inserting before the last sentence thereof, a new sentence, as follows:

'No person whose license for sale of liquor expires pending an appeal from conviction of a violation of law forbidding sale of intoxicating liquor on Sunday, by himself or his clerk, servant or agent, on his licensed premises, shall, after subsequent final conviction of himself, clerk, servant or agent be eligible for a liquor license for a period of 5 years from the date of such final conviction.'
