IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Closed Time on Deer in Certain Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 91, amended. The 1st 2 paragraphs of section 91 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes are hereby repealed and the following paragraphs enacted in place thereof:

'There shall be an open season on deer during the period November 5th to December 5th, inclusive, in each calendar year in the area south and west of a zone line formed by the Appalachian Trail, beginning at the point where it crosses the Maine-New Hampshire line, and continuing northeasterly along it to the point where it crosses the Canadian-Pacific Railroad tracks near Onawa, Piscataquis county; thence, easterly along these tracks to the junction with the Penobscot river at Mattawamkeag; thence, west of the Penobscot river to its mouth and in the islands in Penobscot bay which are situated in Waldo and Knox counties.

There shall be an annual open season on deer during the period November 1st to December 5th, inclusive, in each calendar year in the area beginning at Mattawamkeag; thence, south of the Canadian-Pacific Railroad tracks to the point where they enter Canada near Vanceboro, Washington county; and east of the Penobscot river south of this line. In Penobscot bay this area shall include those islands situated in Hancock county.

There shall be an open season on deer in each calendar year during the period October 15th to November 30th, inclusive, in the area north of the zone line formed by the Appalachian Trail and Canadian-Pacific Railroad tracks described in the first paragraph.'
