AN ACT Relating to Membership in Maine State Retirement System of Maine National Guard Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 63-A, § 3, sub-§ VII, additional. Section 3 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes as enacted by section one of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered VII, to read as follows :

‘VII. Any person who was an employee on December 31, 1941 and who thereafter transferred to the Maine National Guard and employed pursuant to section 90 of the National Defense Act of June 3, 1916 (32 U. S. C., § 42) shall be considered a member of the retirement system if such person makes payments to the State retirement fund in the same amounts and during the same periods as the other State employees have made to said fund and any such person shall be permitted to make up any such amounts due to said fund. Any person to whom the provisions of this subsection are applicable shall be entitled to all the rights and benefits which he could have accrued had he been employed by the State.’
