STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Orders of and Appeal from Public Utilities Commission re Automatic Signals at Railroad Crossings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 46, § 89-A, additional. Chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 89-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 89-A. Orders of Commission communicated in writing; appeal. The order of the Public Utilities Commission relating to any matter upon which they may act under the authority of section 89 shall be communicated in writing to the railroad company involved and to all persons to whom notice of hearing was given. Any person aggrieved by such order, who was a party to such proceedings, may appeal from such order to the Superior Court within and for the county in which such crossing is located in the manner now provided by law for appeals from findings of the Public Utilities Commission.'
