STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Prohibiting Dogs Running at Large.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 96-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 96-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 96-A. Dogs running at large. From February 1st to March 31st of each calendar year, both dates inclusive, it shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit said dog to roam-at-large in any area frequented by deer. Except that hunting dogs, commonly used for hunting purposes, may be used for this purpose, during the period from February 1st to March 31st, when accompanied by the owner or other authorized person. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, and costs, which fine and costs shall not be suspended.'
