RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Conservation Education.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the usual effective date for legislative acts comes late in the spring or early summer; and

Whereas, the funds referred to below are to be used to establish a summer program for the training of teachers beginning the last week in June; and

Whereas, funds will be needed well in advance of the summer program; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Conservation education for teachers. Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to spend its funds to further training in conservation education for teachers and children up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 and up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1959. Such moneys may be expended for capital improvements on the property of Conservation Education Foundation.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Funds would be taken from the budget of the Division of Information and Education and would be spent developing wise resource-use education through workshops involving teachers and children under the co-direction of the State Department of Education and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game.
