STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications for Admission to Practice Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 105, § 4, amended. The 1st sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 4 of chapter 105 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'In addition to the foregoing requirements, each applicant shall produce to the said Board satisfactory evidence of having ~~pursued~~ **successfully completed** the study of law in the office of some attorney or in some law school approved by said Board for at least 3 years prior to examination or of having graduated from a law school approved by said Board and that he has been a bona fide resident of the State for the 6 months last past.'
