STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Jurisdiction of Trial Justices in Towns of Kittery and York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1915, c. 153, repealed. Chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1915 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1911, c. 279, § 2, sub-§ (a), amended. Subsection (a) of section 2 of chapter 279 of the private and special laws of 1911 is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘(a) Exclusive jurisdiction of all such criminal offenses and misdemeanors committed within the said municipal district as are cognizable by trial justices. **Trial justices in the town of Kittery and York, in the county of York, shall have concurrent jurisdiction with The Yorkshire Municipal Court of all criminal offenses, including all violations of town by-laws, in said towns.**’
