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### MEMORIAL

**To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of  
America in Congress Assembled.**

Joint Resolution Memorializing Congress to Enact Legislation Concerning  
Unjustified Price Increases of Crude Oil and Refined Petroleum Products.

**We**, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State  
of Maine in the Ninety-eighth Legislative Session assembled, most respectfully  
present and petition your Honorable Body as follows:

Whereas, the American public is seriously concerned and does have increasing  
doubts related to what may be the unjustified price increases of crude oil and  
refined petroleum products; and

Whereas, remedial legislation can have consideration only at the National level,  
now, therefore, be it

**Resolved:** That we, the memorialists, recommend to the Congress of the  
United States that Senate Resolution 64 before the Senate Committee on Inter-  
state and Foreign Commerce be considered of utmost importance, and be it  
further

**Resolved:** That a copy of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary  
of State, be immediately transmitted by the Secretary of State to the Senate and  
House of Representatives in Congress, the membership of said Senate and House  
of Representatives from this State and to the presiding officers of each of the  
Legislatures in the New England states.
