STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Creating an Advisory Committee on Education.

Advisory Committee on Education; created. Resolved: That the recent Advisory Committee on Education be commended for their arduous work and excellent report; and be it further

Resolved: That the Governor be authorized to create a permanent Advisory Committee on Education; and be it further

Resolved: That the Governor appoint a chairman and any number of members, to a continuing Advisory Committee on Education, as he may deem necessary to study the problems of education in the State, together with problems of departmental organization and to recommend solutions to these problems in order of their importance and critical urgency, and to make periodic reports of their finding and proposals to the Governor, the Department of Education and to the Legislature when practical; and be it further

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund of the State the sum of \$2,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

Such appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Since education of Maine children and adults is one of the essential duties of State Government, an Advisory Committee is necessary to aid in coping with the many and varied problems that arise.
