RESOLVE, In Favor of Town of Milo for Burial Expenses for Son of William S. Stone.

Town of Milo; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the State the sum of \$70 to be paid to the town of Milo to reimburse it for the burial expenses for the son of William S. Stone.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On January 4, 1956, William S. Stone left a small child of his that had died in a lumber camp somewhere north of Brownville Junction, with the Lary Funeral Home, Inc. in Milo.

Mr. Stone made no arrangements for the burial of this child, neither did he nor his wife attend the committal services. His whereabouts was and is unknown.
