STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Retirement of Members of Portland Police Department not under State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1927, c. 75, § 1-B, additional. Chapter 75 of the private and special laws of 1927, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 1-B, to read as follows:

'Sec.1-B. Retirement benefits for those not under State Retirement System. Any member of the city of Portland police department, who is not a member of the Maine State Retirement System and who has creditable service of at least 25 years as a policeman, may be retired at $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation; provided such retirement is requested by the member. If any such member should become eligible under the provisions of any other system, as a result of prior service and membership service, to a retirement allowance in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation, he shall be entitled to the higher retirement allowance.'
