STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of a Classroom, Library, and Auditorium Building at Washington State Teachers' College.

Classroom, library, and auditorium building; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund the sum of \$405,000 in favor of Washington State Teachers' College to construct a classroom, library, and auditorium building. Funds appropriated under the resolve shall be expended on recommendation of the State Board of Education and approved by the Governor and Council; and be it further

Resolved: That the moneys appropriated by this resolve shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of the resolve have been accomplished.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This building is in accordance with the State Board of Education's plan for enlarging and improving the facilities of the college, and for providing facilities essential to accreditation. The building would include library space for a reading room and stacks for 25,000 volumes; six classrooms; conference room; student union; faculty offices; and an auditorium to seat 500 persons. Present library, student union, faculty office and auditorium spaces are non-existent or extremely inadequate, and present classroom space is limited and will not provide for enlargement of college enrollment.
