STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of a Physical Education and Athletics Field at Washington State Teachers' College.

Physical education and athletics field; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund of the State the sum of \$20,770 in favor of Washington State Teachers' College for the construction of a physical education and athletics field. Funds appropriated under this resolve shall be expended on recommendation of the State Board of Education and approved by the Governor and Council; and be it further

Resolved: That the moneys appropriated by this resolve shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of the resolve have been accomplished.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Washington State Teachers' College does not have tennis courts, baseball fields, women's recreation area, or any developed outdoor areas to carry on the physical education program needed for college students and prospective teachers. It is planned to develop land owned by, and to be acquired by, the State for tennis courts, women's hockey field, and a baseball field; including necessary drainage, grading, landscaping, walks, and equipment. This project has been approved by the State Board of Education as part of the plan for improving and enlarging facilities at Washington State Teachers' College.
