STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Granting Mining Rights by Forest Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 36 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. Granting rights to cut timber; grant mining rights; leasing camp sites and mill privileges; preference to Maine people. The Commissioner, under the direction of the Governor and Council, shall sell at public or private sale and grant rights to cut timber and grass belonging to the State, and may lease camp sites, mill privileges, dam sites, flowage rights, the right to set poles and maintain utility service lines and the right to construct and maintain roads, and grant mining rights, on lands belonging to the State, on such terms as they direct; also the right to cut timber and grass and lease camp sites, mill privileges, dam sites, flowage rights, the right to set poles and maintain utility service lines and the right to construct and maintain roads, and grant mining rights, on public reserved lots in any township or tract of land until the same is incorporated, on such terms as they direct. Preference in such sales or leases shall be given to persons, firms or corporations of this State.'
